Bodegas Langa: Since 1867 Bodegas Langa remains family owned and operated and the only bodega in the Calatayud region that is not a cooperative today. 153 years later and with the 5th generation leading the way, a member of the Langa family is still in every aspect of the operation. Responsible for founding the Calatayud DOP in 1967.

Estate grapes are grown in either of their two estate vineyards located in the foothills of mountains roughly 2.5 miles from each other. The vineyards have very different microclimates, and each bring their own distinct influence to the wine. No herbicides, pesticides, or chemicals of any kind are used in the vineyards. All their wines and Cavas are produced organically with the European certification.

Tasting notes: Fruit leaning towards red cherry and plum but maintains its drive. Toasted spiced aromas with vanilla and cinnamon. Full-bodied with good acidity that is balanced by soft fatty tannins.

Appellation: DOP Calatayud

Grapes: 100% Garnacha (indigenous to the area)

Soil: Los Yermos: clay and stones from the Armantes mountains.

El Col: limestone and slate located in the Frasnó mountain pass

Elevation: 1,968 – 2,624 ft

Vineyard practice: No use of pesticides in vineyard, EU organic agriculture certification and sustainable practices

D.O. Calatayud: Viticulture and wine making in Calatayud dates to 153 BC. One of the oldest to exist in Spanish territories and indeed Europe. Located in northern Spain south of the Pyrenees foothills. The mountainous area encompasses an intricate hydrographical network formed by various tributaries of the Ebro River. The vineyards grow down the slopes of the mountains, at altitudes ranging between 1800 and 3400 ft. Climate is Continental Mediterranean with hot summers and cold winters. Snow is typically on the ground in the vineyards for 5 to 7 months per year. There is a significant temperature difference between day and night temperatures, particularly during the growing and ripening periods. Rainfall averages vary throughout the area receiving 300-550 mm a year depending where they are located.
