## Txakoli 2022



Bodega Zudugarai: The Errasti family has been growing grapes for up to 50 years and over 3 generations. In 1989 when Getariako Txakolina received its D.O. status, the Errasti family changed their strategy from selling their harvest to making wine using only their estate grapes. Zudugarai is the oldest cellar on the Cantabrian Coast. The family directly controls every process, from the selection of the grapes to the cellar's storage and are focused on safeguarding this unique indigenous product. New techniques and formulas are gradually being introduced to the vinicultural process to reveal more of the characteristics of their Txakoli. This does not mean they wish to make a wine that is different from the traditional Txakoli, they are merely seeking to improve upon it.

Tasting notes: White fruit aromas with fine herbs and a salty sea breeze. Fresh and energetic as soon as it hits the lips. Long and balanced mouthfeel with the aromatic intensity revealing itself along with sweet citrus fruits of lemon and lime.

Soil: Clay covered by a layer of sandy soil

Vineyard practice: Integrated viticulture, a model of sustainability using agrochemical products that are compatible with the environment for the control of pests and disease to produce wine in a natural and respectful way. Vegan

D.O. Getariako Txakolina: The Basque region, located along Spain's northern coast adjacent to France, is the most independent of all Spain's autonomous regions. Wine growing and making has been happening since the 1500's but it wasn't until 1989 that a handful of growers came together to renew the wine sector and became officially recognized as a Denomination of origin status, as well as the first of the sub-regions. Only the indigenous Hondarrabi Zuri and Hondarrabi Beltza varietals are grown in Getaria region.
